

Evacuation Mapping




- Provides rapid deployment.

Regional District of Kootenay Boundary Declaration of State of Local Emergency

ORDER

WHEREAS a wildfire has occurred within the Regional District of Kootenay Boundary;

AND WHEREAS the wildfire presents imminent threat to life;

AND WHEREAS this wildfire emergency requires prompt coordination of action or special regulation of persons or property to protect the health, safety or welfare of people or to limit damage to property;

NOW THEREFORE:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED pursuant to Section 12 (1) of the *Emergency Program Act* (RS, 1996, Chap 111) that a state of local emergency exists in Rock Creek to Westbridge on Highway 33 and Rock Creek to Johnstone Creek Provincial Park on Highway 3 due to wildfire and imminent threat to life;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT the Regional District of Kootenay Boundary, its employees, servants and agents are empowered pursuant to Section 13 (1) of the *Emergency Program Act* to do all acts and implement all procedures that are considered necessary to prevent or to alleviate the effects of the emergency, including:

- Acquire or use any land or personal property considered necessary to prevent, respond to or alleviate the effects of an emergency or disaster.
- Authorize or require any person to render assistance of a type that the person is
 qualified to provide or that otherwise is or may be required to prevent, respond to or
 alleviate the effects of an emergency or disaster.
- Control or prohibit travel to or from any area designated in the declaration within the local authority's jurisdiction.
- Provide for the restoration of essential facilities and the distribution of essential supplies and provide, maintain and coordinate emergency medical, welfare and other essential services in any part of the local authority's jurisdiction.
- Cause the evacuation of persons and the removal of livestock, animals and personal property from any area designated in the declaration within the local authority's

jurisdiction that is or may be affected by an emergency or a disaster and make arrangements for the adequate care and protection of those persons, livestock, animals

 Authorize the entry into any building or on any land, without warrant, by any person in the course of implementing an emergency plan or program or if otherwise considered by the local authority to be necessary to prevent, respond to or alleviate the effects of an emergency or disaster.

- Cause the demolition or removal of any trees, structures or crops if the demolition or removal is considered by the local authority to be necessary or appropriate in order to prevent, respond to or alleviate the effects of an emergency or disaster.
- Construct works considered by the local authority to be necessary or appropriate to prevent, respond to or alleviate the effects of an emergency or disaster.
- Procure, fix prices for or ration food, clothing, fuel, equipment, medical supplies or other essential supplies and the use of any property, services, resources or equipment within any area designated in the declaration within the local authority's jurisdiction for the duration of the state of local emergency.

ORDERED by the Chairperson of the Regional District of Kootenay Boundary this date August 13, 2015 at 15:42 to remain in force for seven days until August 20 at 15:30 unless cancelled by order of RDK0 or the Solicitor General.

Trail, August 13, 2015, 18:17:

A wildfire started at approximately 1:00PM north west of Rock Creek 8C. The fire spread quickly and the immediate area, Hulme Creek Road was evacuated.

The fire spread quickly north forcing people in the Kettle River Provincial Park to evacuate on foot and the evacuees were tactically evacuated by incident command.

Residents on Christian Valley Road to Fiva Creek were evacuated. Evacuees are directed north, up the Christian Valley Road to Lumby.

Evacuees from Rock Creek to Westbridge are being directed Willow Park Church in Kelowna on Highway 33.

RDKB Christina Lake Evacuation Exercise 2015

Scenario: On August 10th, 2015 lightning caused a wildfire near Ferry County approximately 22 kilometers south of Christina Lake near the Canada US Boarder. The fire continues to grow fueled by drought, heavy timber and heavy winds. US Fire Flighting efforts have been hampered by depleted resources extreme terrain and fire behaviour. On Aug 23rd the Stickpin Fire has now grown to 18,800 hectares and has travelled to within 5 kilometers of the boarder burning North East towards Christina Lake.

First Stage of Scenario

Update: Aug 25°, 2015@ 0700 am, a series of storm cells producing heavy winds thunder and lighting is moving from the SW through the area. Wildfire Management Branch has reported that the Stickpin Fire has intensified and has now moved within 12 hours of Christina Lake moving NE towards the Ponderosa Subdivision. The need for an evacuation Alert has been agreed upon by Wildfire Mgmt IMT IC and REOC Director at 0730 hours, and has been handed over to the Operations Chief for implementation.

Second Stage of Scenario

Update: Aug 25th, 2015 @ 1330 hours, Wildfire Management Branch Type 1 Incident Commander has called the REOC requesting an Evacuation order. The REOC Director and Wildfire Mgmt IMT IC agree an Evacuation order is required for the residents of:

- Zone 73 Santa Rosa pop 34
- Zone 74 Cascade Ponderosa pop 170

Notes: This exercise is based on the need to evacuate two areas as outlined in the RDKB Electoral Area C Evacuation Map. The first stage of the scenario will focus on the notification of residents; the second stage will focus on an evacuation order. The goal of this exercise is to work together as a group in order to enhance the planning and implementation stages of a potential evacuation. This will also allow us to determine time frames, build group dynamics and resource allocation.

Additional Input as Required

During the evacuation order a US boarder spokesperson has called the EOC advising that he has a line up of US evacuees wanting access into BC, approximately 120.

SITE Alert Injection#1: Door to door personnel have come across a commercial rancher with a dozen horses, and are requesting assistance.


EOC Alert Injection#2: The EOC receives a call from Canada Boarder Services, there are cars lined up as far as they can see wanting to evacuate to Canada.

SITE Order Injection#3: While handing out the last evacuation orders in the Ponderosa subdivision personnel have come across a household (6 People) without a vehicle. They wish to leave but have no means.

Evacuation Alert Procedures

This Evacuation Alert has been issued by the Regional District of Kootenay Boundary (RDKB) Emergency Operations Centre (EOC). An alert is being issued due to potential danger to life and health due to an interface wildfire.

The intention of this Evacuation Alert is to prepare you to evacuate your premises or property should it be necessary. If an Evacuation Order is issued you will be required to leave immediately.

You should prepare for the possibility of an evacuation order by:

- Locating all family members or co-workers and designate a meeting place outside the evacuation area should an evacuation be called while separated. Arrange accommodation for your family if necessary.
- Gathering essential items remember the 5 P's (People, Pets, Prescriptions, Papers and Photos)
- Preparing to move any disabled persons and /or children
- Moving pets and livestock to a safe area
- Monitoring news sources for information on evacuation orders

What to do in the event an Evacuation Order is issued

An evacuation alert may be followed by an immediate order to evacuate should conditions worsen. In case of an evacuation order, you must leave your home immediately and vacate the area by using local roads and use Highway 3 to Highway 38 or Highway 22 to travel east to Trail. Please report to the Emergency Support Services Reception Centre at the Trail Memorial Centre (Arena) at 1051 Victoria Street in Trail, BC (see map on reverse). It's important to register to receive emergency services such as support and family reunification. If you're unable to physically check in at the reception centre you can call 1-888-350-6070.
